- >> STEEPED IN TRADITION: The ADAC GT Masters is in its 19th season in 2025, making it the longest-running GT3 series in the world.
- >>> SIX ROUNDS: This year's calendar features six events in three countries - three in Germany, one in the Netherlands, and two in Austria. Two shorter onehour races will be held on the three sprint race weekends. The three endurance events each consist of two 80-minute races.
- >>> EQUAL OPPORTUNITY: The "Balance of Performance", based on the world's leading system from the SRO Motorsports Group, is used to level up all the cars, ensuring that every team has a fair chance of winning.
- >>> EXCLUSIVE TYRE PARTNER: All the cars in the ADAC GT Masters start on standard tyres from exclusive partner and Formula 1 supplier Pirelli.
- >> SUSTAINABILITY: This topic remains a priority in the ADAC GT Masters. As of this season, the series will run on a new synthetic and climate-friendly fuel. As well as many other innovations, the new slicks from tyre partner Pirelli also contain a natural rubber component, which has been certified by the FSC. The successful "Bottle-Free Zone" campaign also continues in the 2025 season. In cooperation with BWT, the ADAC

is using this initiative to help reduce plastic waste for the fifth year in a row.

- >>> TANDEM: Two drivers share each car, changing places at the wheel during a mandatory pit stop. At least one driver must be classed as a Silver or Bronze driver. Since the 2024 season, Platinum drivers are no longer eligible.
- >>> RECIPE FOR SUCCESS: The "Road to DTM" competition sees talented and ambitious young drivers battle it out for points and promotion to the DTM.
- >> FESTIVAL IN THE EIFEL MOUNTAINS: From 11th to 13th July, the ADAC GT Masters will start as part of the ADAC Truck Grand Prix at the Nürburgring for the third year in a row. Last year, the iconic event attracted 130,000 fans to the Eifel region, making it the event with the biggest crowd of the 2025 season.
- >> LIVE-ACTION: There are more options than ever for watching the ADAC GT Masters in 2025. TV station SPORT1 is broadcasting selected races on TV and all the races on Sport1.de. Free streaming platforms Joyn and ServusTV ON are also showing all twelve races live and free of charge. All the races are also available with English commentary on the ADAC Motorsport You-Tube channel. Globally, the races are broadcast live or replayed in full in 120 territories.

NEW TO THE ADAC GT MASTERS IN 2025

Here is an overview of the most important changes ahead of the 2025 season in the ADAC GT Masters

>> A NEW SUPER SPORTS CAR IOINS THE FIELD

Another challenger will attempt to conquer the ADAC GT Masters in 2025: the new Ford Mustang GT3. Haupt Racing Team will run three of the new 2024 version of the Mustang, which boasts a 5.4-litre, naturally-aspirated V8 engine. Ford last lined up in the ADAC GT Masters a decade ago. Back then, the predecessor to the Mustang, the Ford GT, claimed a total of five race wins.

>> NEW TEAMS PUT PEDAL TO THE METAL

Two new teams join the ADAC GT Masters in 2025. The first newcomer is razoon - more than racing, who are already familiar from the ADAC GT4 Germany series, in which the Austrian team already has two race wins to its name. The team from the Styria region is now looking to hit the ground running in the ADAC GT Masters with a Porsche 911 GT3 R. The second new permanent starter is SR Motorsport by Schnitzelalm. The team from the Allgäu caught the eye on a number of guest appearances over the past two years, and will be the only outfit to run the Mercedes-AMG GT3.

>> NEW RACETRACK

For the first time since the ADAC GT Masters was launched in 2007, this year's calendar includes the Salzburgring. The "Motorsportfestival Salzburgring" will take place on the outskirts of the Mozart city from 5th to 7th September.

>> EXCITING ENDURANCE FORMAT

The 2025 ADAC GT Masters has a far greater focus on endurance. This year, three weekends will exclusively feature the new endurance format - that is half of the season's races.

At the Lausitzring, Nürburgring and Salzburgring, both races will be held as 80-minute long-distance events. In each of these races, there will be two mandatory pit stops, including a driver changeover, refuelling and a tyre change. The events in Zandvoort, at the Red Bull Ring and in Hockenheim will be held according to the triedand-tested sprint format, with two 60-minute races

>> FOCUS ON SUSTAINABILITY

From this season, the ADAC GT Masters will be using a new synthetic and fully sustainable fuel. This innovative and climate-friendly fuel will contribute to the decarbonisation of the DTM platform and reduce CO2 emissions. The "DTM Pro Climate" fuel will be used in the DTM, the ADAC GT Masters and ADAC GT4 Germany this season.

This season, Pirelli will supply a new tyre: the P ZERO DHG. It heats up faster, has a larger working window, and is also more consistent over the distance. As well as pure performance, development also focussed on the environmental aspect. The tyres have a sustainable, natural rubber component and are approved by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC). By using the new fuel in the DTM, ADAC GT Masters and ADAC GT4 Germany, the ADAC is also living up to its claim of making motorsport sustainable.





































>> THE CHAMPIONSHIP

At the end of the season, the driver/pair of drivers with the most points will be crowned "ADAC GT Masters champion". All drivers are eligible for this classification. The top 15 in each race score points – 25 for the winner, one point for 15th place. The fastest three in qualifying are rewarded with three points, two points and one point respectively. In every race, the two best-placed cars from each team score points towards the ADAC GT Masters Team championship. The following titles are also up for grabs: ADAC GT Masters Silver Cup champion (Silver/Silver pairing), PRO-AM champion (Gold/Bronze or Silver/Bronze pairing), AM Cup champion (Bronze/Bronze pairing), and "Road to DTM" champion.

>> THE "ROAD TO DTM" PROMOTION CONCEPT

The concept for talented young drivers to achieve promotion from the German Kart Championship (DKM), through ADAC GT4 Germany and the ADAC GT Masters, and into the DTM has been in place 2024. All drivers with a Silver classification who are under 25 years of age and compete in the Silver or Pro-Am Cup are eligible. The winner receives support in the form of the entry fee for the following DTM season. The youngsters receive standard points for the results of their races, which they contest alongside a driving partner. Points, from ten to one, are also awarded for qualifying results, which are achieved individually. Conversely, breaches of the rules, warnings and self-induced grid penalties result in up to five minus points.

>> THE RACE FORMATS

In the ADAC GT Masters, three race weekends follow the sprint format, and three the endurance format. The sprint

events (Zandvoort, Red Bull Ring and Hockenheim) each feature two 60-minute races, in which a pit stop, complete with driver changeover, must be completed between the 25th and 35th minute of the race. Tyre changes and refuelling are not permitted in these races. The endurance events (Dekra Lausitzring, Nürburgring and Salzburgring) are each contested over two 80-minute races. Two driver changeovers and one tyre change must be completed in the two pit stops, one of which must be made between the 15th and 25th minute of the race, the second between minutes 55 and 65. Refuelling is permitted during

>> THE DRIVERS

The field in the ADAC GT Masters consists of aspiring and talented youngsters, and ambitious amateur drivers. Each car is shared by two drivers. In the sprints, a driver changeover must be completed midway through the race. In the endurance races, two driver changeovers are mandatory. All the competitors are classed in three categories according to the "FIA Driver Categorisation System", based on the experience gained and success enjoyed in their career so far. Professionals are given Gold status, semi-professionals correspond to the FIA category Silver, and non-professionals have the Bronze classification. Since 2024, Platinum drivers and all-Gold pairings are no longer permitted in the ADAC GT Masters.

Only production-based sports cars that meet the global GT3 standard are eligible to start. The cars weigh between 1,250 and 1,288 kilograms, generate over 550 hp and can be purchased race-ready. The engines are, for the most part, production engines with specific modifications. For this reason, there is a host of different technical

concepts. However, only rear-wheel drive is permitted. Equal opportunity is achieved through the "Balance of Performance", which uses additional weight or the manipulation of engine power to regulate the performance of the differently modified cars. This is adapted over the course of the season to suit the different circuit layouts, and can also be amended during a race weekend.

>> THE TYRES

The new Pirelli slick can be brought up to the optimal temperature quicker, has a larger working window, and is more consistent over the distance. It contains a sustainable natural rubber component and is approved by the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC). As such, it is in line with the ADAC's approach to make motorsport sustainable.

>> FREE PRACTICE AND RACES

The drivers have two free practice sessions, each lasting 45 to 60 minutes, to prepare for the race and test the set-up of their car. The grid positions for each of the weekend's two races are determined in two 20-minute qualifying sessions. The two drivers must each contest one qualifying. The races begin with a rolling "Indy" start and last 55 minutes (sprint) or 80 minutes (endurance).

>> HANDICAP WEIGHTS

Podiums have consequences in the ADAC GT Masters. After each race, the top three are "rewarded" with success ballast. The winner receives an extra 20 kilograms for the coming race. The runners-up must carry an additional 10 kilograms, the third-placed car an extra 5 kilograms. The handicap weights are reset for each race. Practice and qualifying sessions are contested without success ballast.

>> PIT LANE

The maximum speed between the two marks in the pit lane (pit entry/pit exit) is 50 km/h throughout the entire race weekend.

>> PIT STOPS

One mandatory pit stop must be made in each sprint race in the ADAC GT Masters. In endurance races, two stops must be completed. A driver changeover is mandatory during each scheduled pit stop. In the endurance races, the car must not be refuelled and all four tyres must be changed once. If a pit stop does not last the minimum duration, one or more tyres are changed outside of the scheduled stop, or the car pulls into the pits outside the defined time window, the competitors are punished with

time penalties. This does not apply in the case of damaged tyres or when swapping slicks for wet-weather tyres.

>> STATIONARY TIMES

Each driver pairing is assigned a different length of time, for which their car must remain stationary during a pit stop. This is based on an FIA classification and differs between the sprint and endurance format. The aim of this is to make the cars more evenly matched across all the classes, and thus to ensure even more exciting racing.

>> PRIZE MONEY

The total prize money for this season is € 570,000 in financial and non-cash prizes.

>> THE POINTS SYSTEM IN THE ADAC GT MASTERS

- >> Since 2007, the ADAC GT Masters has competed at 13 racetracks in six countries. The Nürburgring has hosted more events than any other venue, with the series starting there on 20 occasions.
- >>> To date, **18 different manufacturers** have gone head to head in the ADAC GT Masters.
- >>> The eventual winner started from pole position in 109 races.
- >> Diversity: 158 different drivers, 51 teams and eleven manufacturers have claimed at least one victory in the ADAC GT Masters. Leading the respective all-time lists are Daniel Keilwitz (22 Triumphe), Callaway Competition (35) and Audi (50).
- >>> The biggest winning margin in qualifying was achieved by Frédéric Vervisch in 2020 at the Lausitzring: the Audi driver was 1.276 seconds faster than the runner-up on a drying track. In contrast, Mirko Bortolotti (2019 at the Nürburgring) and Kelvin van der Linde (2014 in Oschersleben) secured pole position by a mere 0.002 seconds - the narrowest margin to date.
- >> At 58 years, ten months and 13 days, motorsport legend Klaus Ludwig is the oldest race winner in the ADAC GT Masters.
- Double strike: at 21 ADAC GT Masters weekends, both races were won by the same pair of drivers.

- >> The fastest circuit on the calendar is the Red Bull Ring. The fastest race in the history of the series took place here in 2017, with an average speed of 170.9 km/h.
- >> In 2024, Oschersleben produced the youngest podium in ADAC GT Masters history. The average age of the six drivers was 19.5 years.
- >>> Carrie Schreiner drives for Land-Motorsport. She is the 14th woman to have raced in the ADAC GT Masters.
- >>> Landgraf Motorsport became the first team to win three Drivers titles in a row in 2024.
- >>> Elias Seppänen was the first driver to successfully defend his title. There are four two-time champions: Sebastian Asch (2012/2015), Kelvin van der Linde (2014/2019), Christopher Mies (2016/2021) and Seppänen (2023/2024).
- >> Tom Kalender went down in the ADAC GT Masters history books as the youngest champion, at just 16 years, six months and 23 days. He and team-mate Seppänen are also the youngest championship-winning duo in the history of the series, with an average age of 18 years, nine months and seven days.
- >>> Haupt Racing Team successfully defended the Team title in 2024. Only two other teams have ever achieved this feat: 2007/2008 Reiter Engineering in 2007/2008 and Prosperia C. Abt Racing in 2013/2014.





































ADAC MOTORSPORT: NOVATIVE AND SUSTAINABLE

>> ADAC MOTORSPORT: INNOVATIVE AND SUSTAINABLE

Motorsport and sustainability need not be in conflict: by introducing various initiatives in two and four-wheel racing, the ADAC is taking a leading role with regard to sustainable motorsport. From the use of battery-electric and fossil-free drivetrains at the racetrack, in rallying and in junior series, through to sustainable thinking at major events.

>> FOSSIL-FREE FUEL

The ADAC is a pioneer when it comes to fuel. In 2025, the ADAC is introducing a synthetic and sustainable fuel in the DTM, the ADAC GT Masters, and ADAC GT4 Germany. The sustainable fuel significantly reduces CO2 emissions and thus actively contributes to the decarbonisation of the DTM. "DTM Pro Climate" is a fuel produced specifically for the DTM by British manufacturer Coryton.

>> NEW TYRE WITH SUSTAINABLE COMPONENTS

Another new feature of the 2025 season is a newly developed Pirelli tyre, which will see action in the DTM, as well as in the ADAC GT Masters and ADAC GT4 Germany. What makes the new "Pirelli P Zero DHG" so special is that tyre's components are made from FSC-certified natural rubber. FSC stands for "Forest Stewardship Council", an organisation that controls the sustainability of the natural rubber used and guarantees that it is not mixed with non-certified material at any point in the supply chain.

>> ELECTRIC MOTORSPORT

As well as moving to sustainable and innovative solutions for classic combustion engines, other ADAC series also use purely battery-electric and thus zero-emission drivetrains. Furthermore, the ADAC offers sustainable electric series a platform at DTM events. Since 2023, the NXT Gen Cup has emphatically shown what a good combination fully-electric race cars and exciting motorsport

can be. The car of choice in the NXT Gen Cup is the 230-hp LRT NXT1, which is based on the roadworthy Mini Cooper SE. The series is primarily aimed at talented young drivers and has a strong focus on supporting youth development. The world's first fully-electric touring car series for juniors will hold all of its races in the 2025 season on the DTM platform. The NXT Gen Cup will electrify the programme at four events on the ADAC's high-profile platform.

Not only is the ADAC is doing pioneering work with Opel at the racetrack, but also on the rally scene. The ADAC Opel Electric Rally Cup powered by GSe made its debut back in 2021. Competitors go up against the clock in standard Opel Corsa e-Rally cars. The 136-hp cars are not only showcasing the joy of driving electric cars to a broad audience, but are also demonstrating how suitable they are for competition - and in a dynamic environment.

A joint project between the ADAC and Opel, the Cup is full of innovations, from the cars themselves to the charging infrastructure, which was developed specially for the series. This charging infrastructure uses the public power supply, with the respective network operators providing green electricity generated from renewable sources. The ADAC is also going electric when it comes to two

wheels. The ADAC MX Academy uses an electric KTM SX-E5 for its one-day taster courses for children aged between 6 and 13 years.

>> BOTTLE-FREE ZONE

Back in 2021, the ADAC and water technology company BWT launched the "Bottle-Free Zone" - a successful initiative to make events more sustainable. Under the motto "Change the world, sip by sip", free water dispensers in the paddock are reducing the amount of plastic waste and rendering the transport of drinking water unnecessary. Over the past four years, more than 1,000,000 plastic bottles have been saved this way.



THE ADAC GT MASTERS ON TV

Motorsport fans will again be able to watch the ADAC GT Masters on German free-to-air TV on Sport1 in the 2025 season. The ADAC GT Masters races will be broadcast live on various channels belonging to the station, offering the young drivers an ideal platform, both from a sporting and a media perspective.

Furthermore, all the races will be shown live and free of charge on the ProSieben-Sat.1 superstreamer Joyn. Also offering live coverage of the DTM and ADAC GT4 Germany, Joyn is the perfect streaming platform for all motorsport fans. All the races can also be watched later on demand in the extensive media library.

Rounding off the comprehensive streaming service for the ADAC GT Masters is ServusTV. All the races can also be seen live on the free platform ServusTV ON. On YouTube, all the races are shown live with German and English commentary on the @adacmotorsports channel. They can also be watched later here, along with highlights from each race weekend. The ADAC GT Masters not only has an extensive TV presence in Germany, but there is also great interest in the series internationally. In total, the ADAC GT Masters is shown live or replayed in full in over 120 territories and has a reach of over 200 million TV households.


























