Former Formula 1 driver Jos Verstappen (49/NL), father of Max Verstappen, who is currently leading the way in the pinnacle of motorsport, could not miss the opportunity to experience the ADAC GT Masters show at his home circuit. The 49-year-old Dutchman watched both races in the German GT Championship and also checked out the grid.

Laps for a good cause

The BWT Race Lap Award continued in Zandvoort. This sees the ADAC GT Masters and BWT donate four Euros for every race lap in the German GT Championship to b.waterMISSION. The charity builds wells, primarily in Gambia and Tanzania, providing access to clean drinking water. So far, more than € 15,000 has been donated.

It goes without saying that the Euro 2020 final between Italy and England is a major topic of conversation in the ADAC GT Masters paddock. English BMW works driver Nick Yelloly is hoping to at least catch some of the second half: "I am travelling home today too. But if it all works out, I will be able to watch the final 20 or 30 minutes."
