THREE QUESTIONS FOR ADAC SPORT PRESIDENT HERMANN TOMCZYK

ADAC FORMULA 4 IS ENTERING ITS SIXTH SEASON. WHAT CAN WE EXPECT THIS YEAR?

We can definitely expect to see exciting races and an intensive battle for the title. The majority of the drivers is racing for the first time in ADAC Formula 4. It will be interesting to see who asserts themselves and above all how the young drivers develop in the course of the season. As far as the teams are concerned, participation this year remains unchanged, even though the many international race weekends happening at the same time in the second half of the year force them to make compromises. This year's events have also left their mark on ADAC Formula 4. We have had a very international field for some years now. In times when travel is so severely restricted, we quickly notice how this affects us.

>> WHAT SIGNIFICANCE DOES ADAC FORMULA 4 HAVE FOR PROMOTING YOUNG TALENT IN GERMANY?

Simply look at Formula 1 and its frame racing series Formula 2 and Formula 3 and you can see how important the series is. All the German drivers competing there come from ADAC Formula 4 or, in Sebastian Vettel's case, from the predecessor series. The ADAC has been involved in promoting young talent in formula racing for almost 30 years now. I know of no other institution in the world that has been so intensively involved over such a long period of time. During this time, 14 drivers from our series have moved up into Formula 1. The first was Ralf Schumacher, the latest was Lando Norris. But ADAC Formula 4 not only provides a great training ground for formula racing. Around half of the German professional racers in other classes, such as GT or touring car racing, took their first steps in motor racing in our series. We call ADAC Formula 4 the ADAC's high-speed school for good reason.

>>> WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF ADAC FORMULA 4?

We have almost 30 years of experience in junior formula racing, our series have produced Formula 1 world champions such as Sebastian Vettel and Nico Rosberg. The ADAC GT Masters professional event platform provides young talents with optimal conditions for developing their racing skills. We are very well represented in the media thanks to the live racing broadcasts on SPORT1, online or in livestream format. With the Nürburgring, Hockenheim, Red Bull Ring and Zandvoort we have four Formula 1-level circuits on the calendar, which is also an important criterion for a junior series today. We have a proven technical package with the Tatuus chassis, Abarth engines and the standard tyres provided by Formula 1 supplier Pirelli.

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ADAC FORMULA 4

ADAC Formula 4 continues to successfully promote young talent by ADAC and enters its sixth season in 2020. In 2020, the formula youngsters will compete in seven events for a total of 21 races. Uniform Formula 4 racing cars by the Italian manufacturer Tatuus, powered by an Abarth turbo engine, are used. SPORT1 and SPORT1+ broadcast the races live on television, while the races can be watched online in livestream format on sport1.de, youtube.com/adac and adac.de/ motorsport.

THE CAR

The ADAC Formula 4 uses cars with a uniform chassis manufactured by Tatuus. The Tatuus chassis meet the high safety requirements of the FIA. The Italian premium tyre manufacturer Pirelli, known from Formula 1, provides the tyres for ADAC Formula 4. The wheels are supplied by the German company ATS.

>> THE ENGINE

The ADAC Formula 4 racing cars compete using near-series engines from Abarth. The 1.4 litre 414 TF Turbo engine delivers around 160 hp with a maximum torque of 250 Newton metres. The top speed is around 210 km/h. The four-cylinder engine is based on the standard Abarth 500 engine, but has been specially modified for racing use. All engines run with Ravenol RSS SAE 10W-60 engine oil.

THE DRIVERS

ADAC Formula 4 has established itself as one of the world's strongest junior series. Drivers with experience from different formula series compete against ambitious up-and-coming karting drivers. Drivers aged 15 years and older are eligible to start in ADAC Formula 4.











>> THE RACING MODE

A race weekend in ADAC Formula 4 consists of three 30-minute races on Saturday and Sunday. These are preceded by two free practices. Two 15-minute qualifying sessions follow, interrupted by a fiveminute break (15-minute qualifying for race 1 – 5minute break – 15-minute qualifying for race 2).

The starting grid for races 1 and 2 are determined by the times driven in the two qualifying sessions. The driver with the fastest lap time starts from pole position. All other drivers are arranged according to their lap time.

In race 3 the first eight start from race 2 in reverse order (reverse grid), i.e. the winner of race 2 starts from eighth place on the grid, the eighth-placed of race 2 from pole position, etc. The starting positions of the remaining drivers follow from their positions from race 2, i.e. the ninth-placed driver will start from the 9th starting position, the last placed driver from race 2 from the last starting position.

Points are awarded in all series (driver, rookie and team classification) as follows: Place 1/25 points, 2/18, 3/15, 4/12, 5/10, 6/8, 7/6, 8/4, 9/2, 10/1.

>> THE ROOKIE CHAMPIONSHIP

The 'ADAC Formula 4 Rookie Cup' is open to drivers who will race in ADAC Formula 4 for the first time in 2020 and who have not participated in any licensed circuit races for formula or touring car races at home or abroad before 01.01.2020. Independent of the Rookie Cup classification, all 'ADAC Formel 4 Rookie Cup' participants are also classified for ADAC Formula 4 and receive points and prize money.

ADAC FORMULA 4 ON TELEVISION

The TV stations SPORT1 and SPORT1+ will broadcast the ADAC Formula 4 races live or re-live on the race weekends. In addition, SPORT1 reports on the talents of ADAC Formula 4 in a 60-minute ADAC GT Masters magazine, which is broadcast on Sunday evenings after the races. Extensive online and mobile reporting on sport1.de and adac.de/formel-4 as well as in the SPORT1 apps round off the multimedia offerings. Livestreams on sport1.de, the ADAC YouTube channel and the ADAC Formula 4 Facebook page, as well as the ADAC GT Masters magazine on n-tv on Sunday evening of the following week round off the comprehensive coverage of the ADAC's junior formula series.











ADAC FORMULA YOUNG TALENT PROMOTION

The ADAC Formula Young Talent Promotion has been the launching pad for future motorsport stars for almost 30 years. In the past, Formula 1 drivers like today's world champions Sebastian Vettel and Nico Rosberg, Nico Hülkenberg or Ralf Schumacher, DTM stars like Marco Wittmann, Timo Glock or René Rast began their successful careers in the ADAC junior formula series. Mick Schumacher, the son of Formula 1 record world champion Michael Schumacher, raced in ADAC Formula 4 for two years, has already completed his first Formula 1 tests and will compete in Formula 2 in 2020.

Lando Norris raced in ADAC Formula 4 in 2015 – four years later he is a regular driver in Formula 1 with McLaren. Ralf Schumacher's son David moved up to the next-level racing class after winning the ADAC Formula 4 2018 Rookie Championship. In 2019 he raced in the Formula Regional European Championship, in 2020 in Formula 3 with Charouz.

The beginnings of ADAC's promotion of young talent date back to 1991. With the foundation of the ADAC SONAX Formula Junior Championship, the ADAC created a competition with the aim of offering drivers and teams equal opportunities with reasonable budgets and in compliance with the required safety regulations. In the 1991 debut season Christian Abt, former DTM driver and ADAC GT Masters champion, won the overall classification.

Over the years, numerous racing drivers who are now successful have won the BMW ADAC Formula Junior Cup and BMW Formula ADAC Championship titles, including the 1998 Sportscar World Champion and three-time Le Mans winner André Lotterer.

Among the graduates of the ADAC Formula Schools were the two former Formula 1 drivers Christian Klien and Ralf Schumacher, who made his debut in the ADAC SONAX Formula Junior Championship in 1992. Schumacher was the first driver from the ADAC Formula Young Talent Promotion Programme to make the leap into Formula 1, with 14 other drivers to follow. Timo Glock was the last overall winner of the BMW Formula ADAC Championship in 2001 after winning the BMW ADAC Formula Junior Cup the previous year.

In 2002, ADAC together with engine partner BMW heralded a new era in junior formula racing. In the Formula BMW ADAC Championship, completely newly developed racing cars raced against each other. Nico Rosberg won the championship in the premiere season. In the same year the then 17-year-old completed his first test in a Williams Formula 1 car as a bonus for the title.

While Maximilian Götz had to admit defeat to his title rival Rosberg in the 2002 Formula BMW ADAC Championship, he drove to overall victory the following year. The 2012 ADAC GT Masters Champion won against the likes of Sebastian Vettel. His hour struck in the 2004 season. Vettel won 18 of the season's 20 races, setting an eternal record in the Formula BMW ADAC Championship. In 2005 Nico Hülkenberg succeeded the four-time Formula 1 world champion in the championship. Formula 1 driver Hülkenberg was followed by two other overall winners, Christian Vietoris and Jens Klingmann, who laid the foundations for their successful careers in motorsport in the Formula BMW ADAC Championship.

Between 2008 and 2014, the ADAC Formula Masters followed up on the ADAC's many years of successful work with junior drivers in Germany. Both Pascal Wehrlein, the champion of 2011, and Kevin Magnussen from Denmark made it to Formula 1 from the ADAC Formula Masters.

Two former champions of the ADAC Formula Masters have made the leap into international motorsport. The 2009 Champion, Daniel Abt, races in the FIA Formula E Championship. Marvin Kirchhöfer, the ADAC Junior Racer of the Year 2012, competed in GP3 and GP2 and has been active in the ADAC GT Masters since 2017. The other champions of ADAC Formula 4 also have their sights set on a successful career. Marvin Dienst, Champion 2015, was in the 2017 FIA WEC World Sports Car Championship and has been competing in the ADAC GT Masters again since 2019. Joey Mawson, champion of 2016, drove in GP3 in 2018. Mick Schumacher has his sights firmly set on Formula 1. Yuri Vips, the 2017 champion, and the 2018 champion, Lirim Zendeli, have also gained a foothold in motorsport. In 2019 they raced in FIA Formula 3. The 2019 ADAC Formula 4 Champion Théo Pourchaire followed their steps in 2020 and earned a FIA Formula 3 Cockpit as well.
